2017 Volunteers of the Year

The following are excerpts and paraphrases from Ramie Case's introduction to Diane and John Speakman when they received the Eaton Canyon Nature Center Associates' 2017 Volunteers of the Year.

Diane started volunteering in 1985. John started volunteering in 1996. Diane has led more school tours than just about anyone! She has coordinated, led, and participated in trail walks for scouts groups and school children. She also led walks for campers in Summer Nature Camp, Student Naturalists, Fieldtrip in Nature Programs and Journey into the Wild Trail walks.

From 1998 to 2001, Diane served as president of the ECNCA, while John became president of the NCA for 8 years. She also served as Hospitality Chair for the NCA, and was often the person responsible for urging Mike Antonovich and other County officials to show up for our Annual NCA celebrations. She was always our gracious host, ensuring there was enough food at ECNCA and NCA events, sponsor-

Among other ongoing volunteer activities, he is also a member of our Gardening Group and the volunteer design consultant for the California Native Plant Society's Becky Rothenberg garden, located at Eaton Canyon by the staff parking lot.
